CURRENTLY

My PhD was on the problems that occur at the meeting point of Psychotherapy and Spirituality, especially from a client perspective. I am continuing to apply what I have learnt, both as practitioner and researcher. As well as my work at St. Luke's I work in a parish in Stockport and am Chair of the Association for Pastoral and Spiritual Care and Counselling, a division within the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy. I also edit the quarterly divisional journal *Thresholds*.

CURRENT STATUS

Professional Memberships and Clinical Supervision

As you will see from this booklet all of our Counsellors and Psychologists are members of the relevant national professional bodies: **The British Association For Counselling and Psychotherapy (BACP)** and the **British Psychological Society (BPS)**. In order to be members of these national bodies there are strict guidelines around educational training, practical experience, supervision and ongoing professional development. Our staff members fully comply with the requirements of their respective accrediting bodies. In addition to these requirements our clinical psychologists are also supervised by the Director of Clinical Services at the Saint Luke Institute Maryland on a weekly basis through telephone conferencing. The Centre also has a bi-annual accrediting scheme and an internal system of professional development workshops for staff. In January 2009 the Centre became an organisational member of the BACP. As an Organisational Member of BACP we are bound by its Ethical Framework for Good Practice in Counselling and Psychotherapy, the Ethical Guidelines for Researching Counselling and Psychotherapy (where organisations undertake research) and subject to the Professional Conduct Procedure for the time being in force.



The **All Ireland Spiritual Guidance Association (AISGA)** was established in April 2002 in response to a perceived need of many practitioners in the area of spiritual guidance to form a representative group. AISGA is an ecumenical, broadly-based organisation that offers support to practitioners of spiritual guidance, akin to that enjoyed by counsellors. AISGA has the following committees; Ethics, Credentialing and Accreditation, Events Planning and Registration. Patronage was received from The Milltown Institute, All Hallows, CORI, and the University of Wales at Lampeter, for the launch of the Association which took place on the 27th April 2002.
